

ELMWOOD PARK AQUATIC CENTER SAFETY AND HEALTH REGULATIONS:

1. All water park patrons must familiarize themselves with the regulations as posted
2. All patrons must wear a swimsuit. Cutoffs and gym shorts are not permitted. T-shirts are not to be worn in the water.
3. Admission to the pool may be refused to any person having any contagious (or infectious) condition or disease.
4. Admission to the pool may be refused to any person under the influence of alcohol.
5. Children under the age of seven (7) must be accompanied by a paying adult, age 18 or older.
6. Patrons must be at least 40 inches tall to use the water slide.
7. Patrons must go down the water slide one (1) at a time. No catching of children at the slide exit.
8. No food, drinks, gum or tobacco allowed in the water park. Smoking is not permitted in the water park at any time.
9. Diving is not permitted at any time.
10. No shoes are permitted at any time.
11. Eating or drinking is allowed in the concession area only.
12. A cleansing shower is required by State code before entering the water park.
13. Diapers are never to be worn in the water (State of Illinois Health Code).
14. Strollers are not allowed in the water park.
15. Toys, scuba gear, swim fins, goggles with nose pieces and inflatable devices are not allowed in the water park, including, but not limited to, water wings, inner tubes, floaties, etc. Personal Floatation Devices (life jackets) must have a Coast Guard approval statement printed on the device to be permitted.
16. Running, boisterous, or rough play is not allowed.
17. No one is allowed to loiter in the locker rooms.
18. No video or photography allowed in any area of the Aquatic Center.
19. The public address system is for official use only.
20. Persons violating any water park rules whether written or oral will be subject to eviction or other disciplinary action.
21. The Elmwood Park Aquatic Center and its staff are not responsible for lost or stolen items.
22. The Management retains the right to alter current regulations, and to enforce new rules as necessary. Should you require an exception to any pool regulations, see Pool Manager.
23. All other State and local health rules apply.
